#### **Uniform expectations**

We have a school uniform to ensure the children are smart, have equality and a sense of belonging fostering pride in their school. Uniform does not include hair decorations the size of fascinators. Large bows are distracting and detract from the faces of the children so we would be grateful if they are kept for outside school. Earrings are causing difficulty. Latest official guidance states they cannot be worn in PE. When children cannot remove them for six weeks, this means they are missing part of the curriculum. If it is a family tradition to have children's ears pierced you might want to wait for holiday time. Plain studs only, not sparkly ones are allowed in school.

Finally if you are purchasing a new winter coat for your child, please consider the colours in the school uniform policy to help us sustain our standards.

### ESCAPE ROUTES




When fire strikes, it is vital that you and your family know your escape route so you don't waste time. Every second counts in an emergency.

Prepare an escape route, make sure everyone knows it and practice your escape. Keep your escape route clear so there are no obstacles to slow you down. Make sure everyone in the house – including friends and family who may stay over – knows where all keys to doors and windows are key.

#### KITCHEN



The kitchen is a flash point for fires in the home with more fires starting in the kitchen than anywhere else. Make sure that you do not let distraction become a deadly danger in the kitchen.



Keep tea towels and cloths away from the cooker and make sure that all electrical appliances are in good working order.
