On Tuesday we were very lucky to have a visit from some paramedics and their ambulance. We learnt so much about this very important job.

The children were told what to do in an emergency and how to dial 999, we spoke about what information they would need to tell the people on the other end of the phone.

The children were shown practical skills like using bandages and splints. They were also allowed to use the dummy to have a go at resuscitation! The most exciting part of the afternoon was to go inside the ambulance and look at all the equipment on board, from blood pressure and oxygen monitors to blankets.

We must mention a great big thank you to the student paramedics at ARU for sharing their skills with us, it was very informative and a great opportunity for the children!

Meghan, who came 33rd in the Year 5 race, said: "It was windy but fun. I was proud of my friends Bella and Amelie, running for the first time."

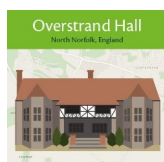
Sam, Year 6, who finished 38th in his first race, added: "It was tense at the start and I found it hard to keep up, but I knew it would be worth it in the end."

The deposit of £65 is required on 14th February 2019 for the Year 5 (current Year 4) residential trip to Kingswood Overstrand in September/October 2019.



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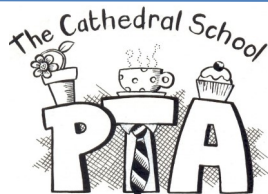
