We often receive suggestions of ideas of things the school should take on and we are always happy to receive ideas. children? In anything we take on, we have to decide if this is the most effective route to the impact and whether it is sustainable and the best use of resources both human and monetary.

This is a speech making competition, where children in each year group from the competing schools prepare a speech on their chosen subject choice for two minutes without notes. We were invited to take part at short notice, but I had no hesitation in accepting in the knowledge that we have many pupils capable of public speaking. Thanks are due to Eve, Rachel, Arabella and George for representing the school this year. Special congratulations to Rachel for her impassioned anti-hunting speech that gained her second place. The judges including a member of the Rotary Club, who said that this was the highest standard over the five years of the competition. As the competition was between Baddow Hall and The Cathedral School, other schools had dropped out; the children should be very pleased with themselves. Next year, we will be able to expand the in-house competition to build and sustain this initiative to benefit our skills in this direction!

She is off to new challenges and the pupils and staff have celebrated her many contributions to the school this week, as a Teaching Assistant, Dance Teacher, Friend and Colleague. 
