Behind the scenes, there have been staff meetings and training and of course forward planning always continues. Classes are announced with reports which take much of the staff time outside the school, but there are some changes due that it falls to me to announce.

Some staff are leaving us this summer and we are inevitably sad to be losing but please for them as they move on in their careers.

Thanks are due to Mrs Hockaday who joined the school to cover a maternity leave and continued to work in Year 2 when other maternity leaves followed. Over the three years, she has supported our pupils to grow and develop and her gentleness as well as firmness has been an important factor in making a difference for so many of the pupils going through Key Stage 1. Mrs Quinn complained to me this week that until now she had not worked with Mrs Britton somethings she regrets as she admired her skill set this week. We hope she doesn't stray far as she starts a well-earned retirement

Finally, Miss Pool who joined the staff school seven years ago. She has made fantastic contributions to The Cathedral School. A very popular class teacher with pupils, parents, staff and governors alike, she has led Years 3 and 4 and more recently Years 5/6. Last year she also brought her wealth of experience and high level teaching skills to Class 4 on Fridays.

So many of our pupils have benefitted from Gardening Club, Eco, Art club and Art projects which she has facilitated and inspired. 


