Riverside development - Car parking disruption.

On Monday 10 July, work will begin to develop the exciting new Riverside Ice & Leisure Centre. During the building works the Leisure Centre will remain substantially open. However, there will be some disruption to selected facilities which we will share with customers at the appropriate time.

Car parking will be significantly reduced throughout the works.

The undercroft car park will be closed between 10-23 July. The rest of the Riverside car park will stay open during this period.

From 24 July, the main open-air section of the Riverside car park will no longer be available for the duration of the building works.

The Riverside Undercroft and Waterloo Lane car parks will only be accessible from Waterloo Lane with diversions in place.

In September the Riverside footpath will also close for the duration of the works. Diversions will again be in place.

How these changes will affect you...

...if you're a Leisure Centre Customer: To reduce the impact of these works, the Riverside Undercroft car park will be available exclusively for Leisure Centre customers from 24 July onwards at the following times:

6am-2pm Monday - Friday

6am-5pm Saturday and Sunday.

Outside of these times, it will be open to all. A new barrier will be in place to keep access exclusive to Leisure Centre customers at these times. Access will be via Waterloo Lane only. Pin codes to exit the barrier will be available at the gym desk, main exit doors or at reception.

Leisure Plus cardholders will be able to claim their first-hour refund from Reception when parking in Riverside Undercroft or Waterloo Lane 1, 2 & 3.

Monthly members who are eligible for a car parking permit will be able to use their permit in the Riverside Undercroft and Waterloo Lane 2 car parks.

Please note from 10 July, members' will no longer be able to use their parking permit in the Regina Road car park.

...if you're not using the Centre: Leisure

You will only be able to use the Riverside Undercroft car park when the barrier is up at these times:

> 2pm-6am Monday – Friday 5pm-6am Saturday – Sunday.

Access is from Waterloo Lane only. At other times, please use one of the car parks in Waterloo Lane or elsewhere in the city centre, such as Townfield Street or Meadows Retail.

...if you cycle or walk past Riverside:

From September, access to Riverside's entrance along the riverside path from Victoria Road will be closed. Please use the pathway between Riverside and Cathedral School instead.

A map of the 24 city centre car parks owned by Chelmsford City Council can be found at www.chelmsford.gov.uk/parking. Where possible, please car share or use alternative transport.
