English for Women

English for Women is a project set up by Chelmsford Cathedral in 2015 to help women who speak little or no English to develop their communication skills and further integrate into their local communities. Free classes run from 10am-12noon on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday during term time at the YMCA, Victoria Road. The project has grown rapidly with women from over 25 nationalities attending to learn English, improve their conversational ability, make friends, learn about the culture of the UK and feel less isolated. The women's pre-school age children are looked after in a crèche to help them focus on learning.

With the project growing we really need more female English speaking volunteers to either work with the women or help with the children. You don't have to be a teacher, you just need to have a neutral English accent, and an enthusiasm to talk with and befriend other women who are trying to integrate into British culture.

If you are able to commit to volunteering at English for Women for one morning a week (Tues, Wed or Thurs) during term time, we'd love to hear from you.


Cathedral Brownie Pack need more help
