Dear Parents

This week's assembly theme was "Problem-Solving" and we looked at the story of Nehemiah from the Old Testament and we are reminded strongly, that "Nothing is impossible with God".

How important it is that we help our children to develop into confident young people who can master the challenges they meet and remain aspirational. Something I was very aware of when I conducted a tour for a very large group of parents considering applying to join the school next September. What was in evidence was that unsolicited, your children were able to express their opinions reflecting their ability to think for themselves. Equally, I can only commend parents at the PTA Special General Meeting for the commitment and problem-solving attitude that can only guarantee a successful year.

The Governor's Resources Meeting on Tuesday approved the Business Plan for an After-School Provision at the School. Originally, we had been pursuing an After-School Club from an external provider on our premises, but with careful planning, we are able to do this in-house for a limited number of places; 12 initially, rising to 18 as soon as possible.

Following the newsletter you will find the After -School Provision Policy and a registration form. Core staffing will be in place early next week and will be announced via email, but as we will start after half term, registration forms need to be in by Thursday for the first cohort to be informed if they are successful next Friday.

I am sure it will not solve everyone's child care challenges and it may be of no interest to many, but for some it may provide a solution. It is not a large provision, but it has had to be planned to be sustainable.

The 2018 'Stop Means Stop' Campaign.

This campaign which is being held across Essex during October it is aimed at drivers and cyclists to promote the requirement under law for them to stop when requested by the school crossing patrol.

Although the majority of drivers understand and follow the law there are still a number of 'drive through' and 'failure to stop' incidents each day which put our patrols and pedestrians at risk of injury, accident or worse. We are trying to make it clear to all drivers that the 'Stop' sign is used for the safety of all pedestrians and that it is the law to stop and remain in the stop position until all pedestrians are out of the road and the patrol has safely returned to the footpath.

Many of our patrols will be wearing a 'Stop Means Stop' tabard over the next few weeks to raise awareness and we have a number of banners which we will display on school railings. We also have some SMS car and book stickers which will be distributed by our patrols.

Please help us get a consistent message across all of Essex by displaying the attached posters around your school and in any newsletters to parents, etc.

Courses are all held outdoors so please be prepared for inclement weather. Refunds will only be given for course cancellations by the centre. To book please call 0208 5009359, with payment by debit or credit card. A parental consent form is also required prior to the session.

All sessions cost £12.50 per child. Bikes are available to hire for an extra £5.00. Courses start promptly so please ensure that children are signed in 15 minutes before the start.
