Editorial

Over the next few weeks the newsletter will have guest staff editorials, this week's Guest Editor is Mrs Southgate.

Wow! What a busy science week. The children of The Cathedral School have been questioning, predicting, observing, testing, evaluating and concluding.

Monday morning's worship got Science week underway with a game of 'Pass the Parcel'. Each class was given a parcel and in order to unwrap a layer they were tasked with answering a scientific question. These questions were based on what the children had been taught this year and there was some great knowledge recall! Once all the layers had gone and all the paper had been recycled each class was the proud owner of a new Science reading book. The texts had been specifically chosen to match the children's curriculum coverage and interest. The classes kept their book for a week and shared their learning during Thursdays worship.

We also launched the science competition. Could the children reason and explain how the contents from one cup 'magically' found its way into another. The experiment was set, the predictions recorded and all that was left to do was wait. Over the course of the week the children watched as the liquids did and didn't do what they thought.

An alternative challenge was presented by way of an energy stick. How could we make it work? How can we light it up? How do we make the sound work? Over the course of the week the energy stick was taken out onto the playground and the children had the opportunity to investigate and apply their knowledge of electricity to solve the problem.

On Thursday each class not only shared their science learning from the week but one final experiment was presented. The children observed an exothermic reaction as we added potassium iodide to hydrogen chloride with a bit of a shuffle, a shake and some washing up liquid. The two chemicals mixed together to create something quite unexpected.

This morning parents were invited into school to hear more about Scientific enquiry and what that looks like at The Cathedral School. Many thanks to those that attended and for the positive feedback.

Today this term's Science competition will be launched and parents have been sent instructions as well as recording sheets so that children can take part.

Thank you to all of the Cathedral school children for their unwavering enthusiasm and the many, many questions that have been asked this week.


If you're stuck for ideas this weekend and would like to continue the science journey then The Museum of Power, Langford is hosting a 'Science Sunday' which looks like great fun!



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

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
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World Book Day 2020!

Emphatic win over St Anne's




A girls team begun their league campaign on Friday night with a comfortable 8-1 victory over St Anne's.
