Eight members of Year 5 represented the school in a Dynamos cricket competition at Great Waltham Cricket Club on Tuesday, finishing a creditable fourth.





Remember, you only need to walk for 10 minutes once a week (park and stride) or walk, scoot or cycle to school in order to achieve your badge.






#### **About Mental Health Awareness Week**
